AMS JOURNALS NOW OPEN ACCESS AFTER ONE YEAR

Move provides quicker access to peer-reviewed scientific research.

JANUARY 22, 2017 – SEATTLE, WA – The American Meteorological Society (AMS) announced journal article content will be available without subscription one year after publication, rather than two years, effective January 2017. This will provide free and open access to the cutting-edge research provided in all AMS journals content more quickly.

AMS's flagship magazine, the *Bulletin of the American Meteorological Society (BAMS)* has allowed for open access articles since it went online in 1998, and the online-only journal *Earth Interactions* has also been fully open access since its creation in 1998. Reducing the paywall-restricted period for the remaining suite of nine scholarly journals provides rapid access to important scientific research in the atmospheric, oceanic, hydrologic, and other related sciences. AMS journals represent some of the most respected publications in their field, with consistently high impact factors, including three that rank in the top 10.

Keith Seitter, AMS executive director, said, "This represents one more example of AMS taking actions that ensure the broadest possible dissemination of research and strong support for the weather, water, and climate community."

AMS journals already provide an opportunity for authors to post their articles as open access immediately upon final publication for a small fee, called "AMS Open Choice."
