

## **Eligibility Requirements:**

- Applicants must be entering their final year of undergraduate study in the fall of 2018 and provide evidence of acceptance as a full-time student at an accredited U.S. institution at the time of the award.
- Applicants must be pursuing a degree in the atmospheric or related sciences.
- Applicants must have a minimum grade point average of 3.25 on a 4.0-point scale.
- Applicants must be U.S. citizens or hold permanent resident status. No age restriction exists.

The Society encourages applications from women, minorities, and disabled students, traditionally underrepresented in the atmospheric and related oceanic and hydrologic sciences.

## **Evaluation and Selection Process:**

The evaluation of applicants will be based on applicant's performance as an undergraduate student, including academic records and recommendations. Final selections will be made by the AMS Executive Committee. The AMS does not prepare written evaluations of either successful or unsuccessful candidates.

### Stipend:

The number of awards and stipend amounts vary depending on sponsorship.

### **Application Instructions:**

Applicants must complete all <u>5</u> sections of the application, provide three written references and official transcripts. All applications must be received by email or postmarked by the deadline date of **2 February 2018**, with supporting materials postmarked no later than two weeks after the application deadline.
