We appreciate your recognition of the importance of NASA Earth Science data to “improve weather forecast[ing] ... that has a tremendous impact on the safety of ... constituents and the flow of commerce across the world” and your efforts to maintain authorization levels for this important program. The data and observations from Earth science missions and research serve as a tremendously important resource that is applied for natural resource exploration and land use planning, as well as assessing water resources, evaluating natural disaster impacts, and enhancing global agriculture production. Additionally, our understanding of Earth is critical to understanding other planets and future space exploration.
