Ask Candidate why they are using text-based web browser. - If the answer is to check their work (typically will be related to how a web server or firewall was set up; the proctor can see what question they have up on screen to get some idea), the Candidate may be allowed to proceed. Proctor should remind Candidate that those tools cannot be used for research or getting help, only for independent work. - If the answer is not to check work, refer to "Candidate uses text-based web browser and it is NOT to check work" rule		
Candidate navigates away from exam delivery window. Candidate screen activity does not match keyboard activity seen by the Web camera	Terminate			The Proctor can see that the Candidate's screen activity does not match keyboard input which could indicate "ghosting" where someone other than the Candidate is controlling the computer.	Terminate the exam. Read the Immediate Termination without Warning script to the Candidate. Log the incident.		
Candidate refuses to comply with a proctor request.	Terminate			The Proctor requests are refused, for example, if the Proctor requests "please pan you camera around the room so I can see around you" and examnee refuses. Or "please hold you hands up away from the keyboard so I can see if the screen activity continues" and the Candidate refuses.	Terminate the exam. Read the Immediate Termination without Warning script to the Candidate. Log the incident.		
Candidate uses software to record screen, capture keystrokes, or otherwise record exam content.	Pause/Terminate			The Proctor can see/hear screen capture software indicators such as a highlighted line around the exam content screen which would indicate outside software was being used.	Pause exam and have Candidate delete files. Once files deleted, Terminate the exam. Read the Immediate Termination without Warning script to the Candidate. Log the incident.		
Candidate closes/leaves Exam session without using End Exam button or without Proctor prompting them that their time is up	Ask				Proctor should attempt to contact Candidate (e.g. via email) and should wait 15 minutes for a response. - If no response, mark Exam as "Completed" and include a note. - If Candidate responds and/or re-establishes connections within 15 minutes, Proctor must use discretion as to whether to allow Candidate to continue or to mark Exam as "Monitor Terminated" or "Completed". Please include a note for further clarification.
