On behalf of the Board on Broadcast Meteorology and the Board on Societal Impacts, welcome to the "Brew City" of Milwaukee, Wisconsin! The name Milwaukee comes from the Algonquin word *millioke*, meaning "gathering place by the water," so what an appropriate location for us to gather and hold this joint conference after being separated for over 2 years by the COVID pandemic! We were originally scheduled to meet last summer in 2021, but unlike a few of the other AMS conferences, YOU all told us you didn't prefer to hold it exclusively virtually. We're thrilled we had the opportunity to postpone it for a year and offer a hybrid version this summer.

Located along the shores of Lake Michigan, water is a big deal in Milwaukee. The city is establishing itself as a Water Centric City, having a vision for a more sustainable community of which water is a central component, and encouraging residents and visitors to gather by the lake and its rivers. For example, access to the city's three rivers—the Milwaukee, Menomonee, and Kinnickinnic—is being reclaimed through the Riverwalk, a 3.1-mile path which combines nature with the history, culture, and entertainment of the city. Using climatology as a guide, we *should* be treated to comfortable days and cool nights, with average highs in the mid 70s and average lows in the upper 50s.

This gathering of meteorologists, climatologists, educators, and communicators has an impressive selection of content. The tradition of extracurricular events continues! This year's conference outing will be on Thursday at Lakefront Brewery, located just a mile away from the Hyatt Regency here in Downtown. Buses depart for the outing at 6:30pm. Your ticket covers a brewery tour, bites to dine on while you get to know your fellow meteorologists, and transportation to the event and back to the hotel. If it's a nice evening, you might even prefer to take a 30-minute stroll along the Riverwalk to get there or back!

Additionally, for all those looking to get an early start and some fresh air before the day of learning/networking begins, we have coordinated morning walks/runs on Thursday and Friday! The walks/runs will depart from the Hyatt at 7am. Each route is about 3 miles. Thursday's route will take us north from the Hyatt along the riverwalk to N. Humboldt, and Friday's will take us east from the Hyatt toward Lake Michigan and through Veterans Park.

There are several other breweries, coffee shops, restaurants, and more within steps of our accommodations here in Downtown Milwaukee, so be sure to check those out in your free time. For those looking to live on the wildside, there is even the opportunity to enter the world of espionage! (just be sure to learn the password first...)

Special thanks to Mike Augustyniak, CPROF Commissioner; members of the Broadcast Board, including Chair Danielle Breezy; and members of the Societal Impacts Board, including Chair Jen Henderson. 
