Report on preparations for upcoming conferences 2019 Joint Satellite Conference AMS/NOAA/EUMETSAT - Ken Holmlund, Mitch Goldberg, Phil Ardanuy

P Ardanuy: Mitch NOAA, Ken EUMETSAT, Phil: AMS. Call for papers is closed. Program has been finalized. Conference is preceded with NOAA workshops, and begins with a welcome drink at the Harpoon Brewery on Sept. 30. Conf Mon-Friday 9/30-10/4/2019. There will be an ice breaker at the end of the first day. High level NOAA/NWS/NESDIS leadership will be in attendance. This is the first time EUMETSAT has met outside the Europe. This is also the first time that NOAA satellite conference has joined EUMETSAT and AMS.

16th Annual Symposium on New Generation Operational Environmental Satellite Systems – Gary McWilliams

Centennial meeting: Deadline for submitting abstracts has passed, total of 143 abstracts were submitted. Symposium is going to run the entire week, one session to recognize the centennial of AMS. One session will be on 60 years of weather satellites, how earth observing satellites contribute to knowledge for the community. Sunday there will be a combined GOES-R JPSS short course. Monday evening will be the 6<sup>th</sup> annual AMS speed networking event which is very popular. Tuesday there will be the lunchtime side panel: Past, present, and future projects for warning for extreme events.

8th AMS Symposium on the Joint Center for Satellite Data Assimilation – Jim Yoe-

44 abstracts received. Efforts are being made for more GLM representation.

3rd Conference on Earth Observing Smallsats – Phil Ardanuy

10th Asia-Oceania Satellite Meteorology Users' Conference – Allen Huang Annual Users Conference: Well attended by Asian countries and corresponding users. No formal announcement yet. This includes 7 WMO Member States.

This is a week-long conference, similar to AMS. It would be natural for AMS to have a joint session in the future as with EUMETSAT. All are welcome to attend and the official announcement is imminent. The convention center and dates are set.

Parallax definition recommended for AMS Meteorology Glossary

"In satellite meteorology, parallax displacements are shifts in the apparent (or mapped) position along a reference ellipsoid of Earth's surface or atmospheric features (e.g. high terrain, clouds, lightning) due to non-nadir viewing geometry. Parallax displacements for features at altitudes above the reference ellipsoid occur in a direction away from the viewer, along the great circle defined by the sub-satellite point and the sub-feature point. The effect is maximized for high-altitude features observed at very oblique viewing angles, minimized for low-altitude features, and non-existent for features observed at nadir."

Definition accepted by AMS. AMS will periodically ask for our advice on definitions like this.

## Update of 5-year plan

K. Schontz: Created one that not only lists the events about the award nominations and deadlines. Initially we want to update the plan with events. We should start thinking about some grand objectives for SatMOC. Current plan includes objectives to conduct annual conferences and have joint sessions.
