- STAC has rejected our STAC Award nomination but instead has asked that we reserve STAC Awards for committee members. Instead, they recommend either a Named Session, Named Symposium or an AMS award.
- o K. Carey reminded everyone of the opportunity to nominate deserving candidates to another AMS committee for the AMS Remote Sensing Prize
- Advocate for science-based decisions related to or involving satellite meteorology, oceanography and climatology systems, techniques, products and tools (Carol Anne Clayson)
  - o K. Carey thanked C. A. Clayson, with much help from David Lubar, for leading our committee's efforts in successfully getting a joint letter signed by the AMS and NWA Executive Directors submitted to the FCC (see the letter at <a href="https://www2.ametsoc.org/ams/index.cfm/about-ams/ams-formal-letters-of-support/joint-letter-with-nwa-concerning-possible-sharing-of-satellite-spectrum/">https://www2.ametsoc.org/ams/index.cfm/about-ams/ams-formal-letters-of-support/joint-letter-with-nwa-concerning-possible-sharing-of-satellite-spectrum/</a>), and the current RF statement at <a href="https://www2.ametsoc.org/ams/index.cfm/about-ams/ams-statements/statements-of-the-ams-in-force/radio-frequency-allocations-for-meteorological-operations-and-research/</a>
  - o Next steps are to update the AMS Statement on Radio Frequency Allocations and engage the weather enterprise.
  - o There are new domestic and international regulatory activities this year concerning microwave bands above 6 GHz, and potential activities in the lower portion of the existing NWS radiosonde and GOES/GOES-R L-band broadcast downlink band.

  - Consider focus for October 2016 AOMSUC-7/AMS-Asia-2/KIMSC-2 conference: reaching users in the Pacific Basin (e.g., training, microwave (e.g., ATMS), data storage, Decadal Survey, cube sats, Air Quality forecasts, societal benefits, etc.)
