3. New WAF Committee Chair: Andrew Molthan (Jan 2015 – Jan 2018). Congratulations and best of luck to Andrew. I'm sure he'll do much better over the next three years than I did.
4. Upcoming conference events:
 - a. 95th AMS Annual Meeting 2015, Phoenix, AZ

 - I'm in the process of lining up a panel of experts from academia, the private sector, and the government. Topic is on job opportunities for recent graduates. Panel members will be from government, academia, and private sector. Each member will give five minute remarks, then moderator will open it up to questions. Panel members so far: John Knox (U. Georgia), Jason Tuell (NWS Eastern Region Director)

- (2) Assisting with the First Symposium on High Performance Computing for Weather, Water, and Climate. I am not sure what our role has been in developing this symposium. Alex and Carolyn are on the program committee and will be chairing or co-chairing sessions. Symposium is 1 day (Thursday 8 January).
- (3) Our WAF Committee Luncheon Meeting will be on Tuesday, Jan 6, Noon to 1:30 PM in the Sheraton Hotel (exact room TBA). I have requested a teleconference capability for our room for those unable to attend in Phoenix.**
- b. The 27th Conference on Weather Analysis and Forecasting, 23rd Conference on Numerical Weather Prediction, set for either Nashville, Philadelphia, or Chicago in the June – Aug 2015 time frame. Sam Ng is our program chair and he will provide an update on preparations for the conferences. Denver didn't work out as no hotels were available within the AMS price range except for the July 4 weekend (we decided this was not a good week for the conference). Brenda Ward is looking into other options (Nashville, Philadelphia, or Chicago). Sam and Andrew are working on putting together a call for papers, which will go out as soon as location is decided.
- c. 96th AMS Annual Meeting 2016, New Orleans:
Mary Cairns (lead program chair for the 2016 meeting) contacted me to see if we might be interested in co-sponsoring some sessions (part of a symposium) focused on the 10th anniversary of Hurricane Katrina. She has also reached out to the Satellite Meteorology, Oceanography, and Climatology committee as a possible partner for us. I took part in a planning teleconference with Mary and President-elect Sandy MacDonald yesterday. A one day (maybe longer) symposium is in the works, with invited and contributed talks and posters. Bruce recommended Andrew as POC, but Andrew can recommend someone else to be point person.

9. **Brent Shaw** provided an update on recent review of suggested additions or modifications to the AMS Glossary of Meteorology. The only new addition is “turbosphere”. Becky noted that the term is already in the Glossary, but the current definition needs to be corrected.

10. Update on the revision of the AMS WAF Statement: The AMS Council granted us a three month extension to obtain Council approval of our revised statement (now Nov 24, 2014). I submitted our draft statement to Melissa Westin about a week ago. Right now, AMS council members are reviewing it, and deciding whether they should make it available for public comments or if it needs more work from WAF first. After public comment it comes back to WAF for consideration of modification.

11. Annual STAC Meeting in Phoenix on Saturday, January 3rd. Andrew and I will attend. Also, anyone interested in serving as a conference program chair in the future might want to attend a training session in the afternoon, roughly starting around 2:30 PM. Location details forthcoming. I encourage attending the conference training session if you are interested in chairing a conference program committee in the future. I will share details about the training in the upcoming weeks.
