- 2. Update on Upcoming Conference Events
 - a. 27th WAF / 23rd NWP Conferences in Chicago
 - i. First committee meeting was held last week to discuss big picture topics. Discussions focused primarily on some key focus areas for solicitation of abstracts and perhaps some brief panel discussions.
 - ii. "The Evolving Role of the Forecaster", "Use and Communication of Uncertainty Information" were initially suggested (final titles likely different), along with specific names for traditional "Forecast Center Overviews" talks.
 - iii. Web page for the conference should be released soon, contains hotel information and other details. Abstracts can be submitted through the AMS online abstracts portal.

 - b. 96th AMS Annual Meeting in New Orleans
 - i. Late last year, WAF committee offered to co-sponsor a one-day Special Symposium on Hurricane Katrina: Progress in Leveraging Science, Enhancing Response, and Improving Resilience, to be held on 12 January 2016. The call for papers has been drafted and is available on the AMS Annual Meeting page.
 - ii. Role of WAF will likely be to select abstracts for a single oral session and help with session chairing, and judging of student poster awards will be offered for the symposium.
 - 1) Jen Alexander and Josh Hacker offered to help with one-day symposium. As the event unfolds, Andrew will provide the organizing committee with contact information for Jen and Josh so that they can help with the organization process.

- a. The STAC has passed around a set of guidelines for handling funding opportunities for students that serve on committees. Waiting to see the final guidelines posted, but the first draft was pretty clear that students remain eligible for all types of support, as long as committees take special care to avoid any real or perceived conflicts of interest (e.g. set up judges for awards external to the committee, etc.)
